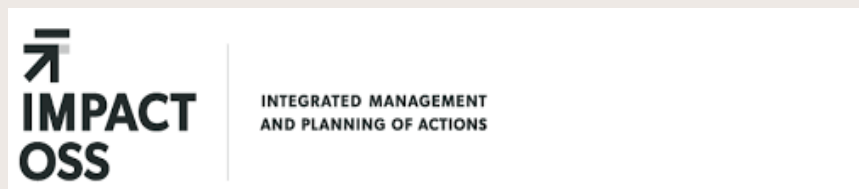
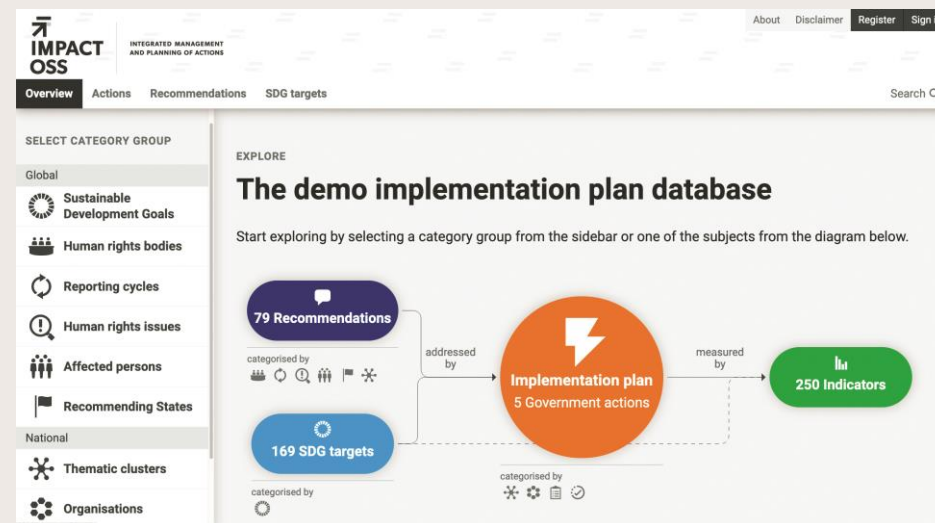

Digital Human Rights Tracking Tools and Databases (DHRTTDs)

Categorization

In broad terms, we divide DHRTTDs into three main categories:

- ❖ **Human Rights Tracking Tools:** specialized in monitoring the lifecycle of human rights recommendations, identifying progress and responsible domestic actors whilst ensuring alignment with the SDGs to promote an integrated approach to human rights and development.
- ❖ **Human Rights Measurement Projects:** Utilizing social science, data and technology, these projects develop indicators and indexes to assess human rights conditions quantitatively.
- ❖ **Human Rights Databases:** Comprehensive repositories that aggregate a vast array of human rights recommendations, case law and international standards. They serve as crucial resources for reference and research, offering easy access to detailed human rights information.

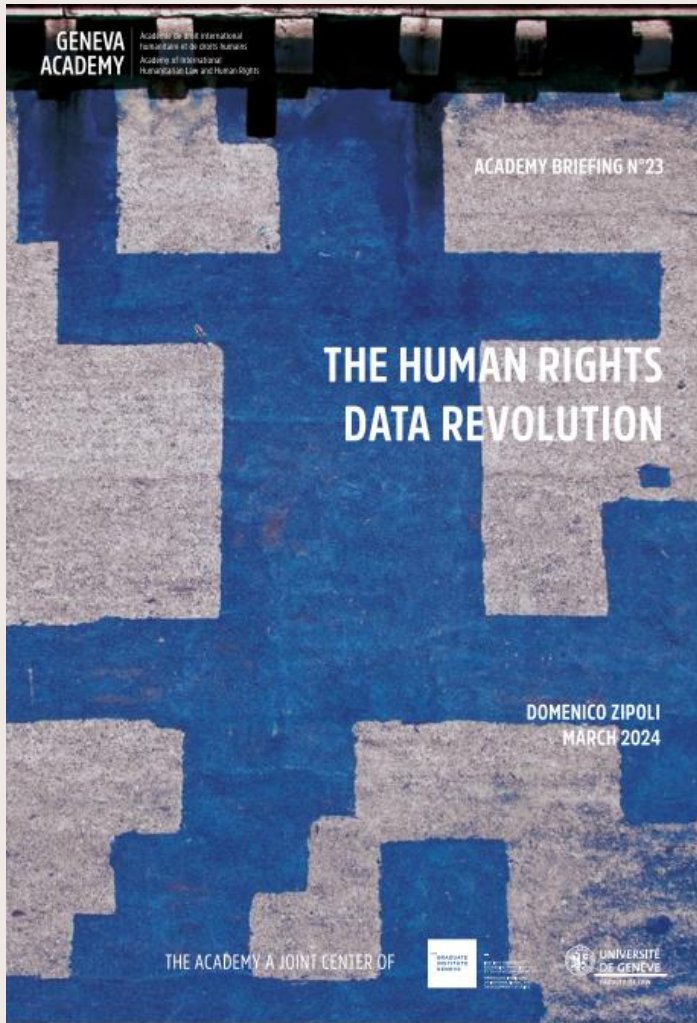

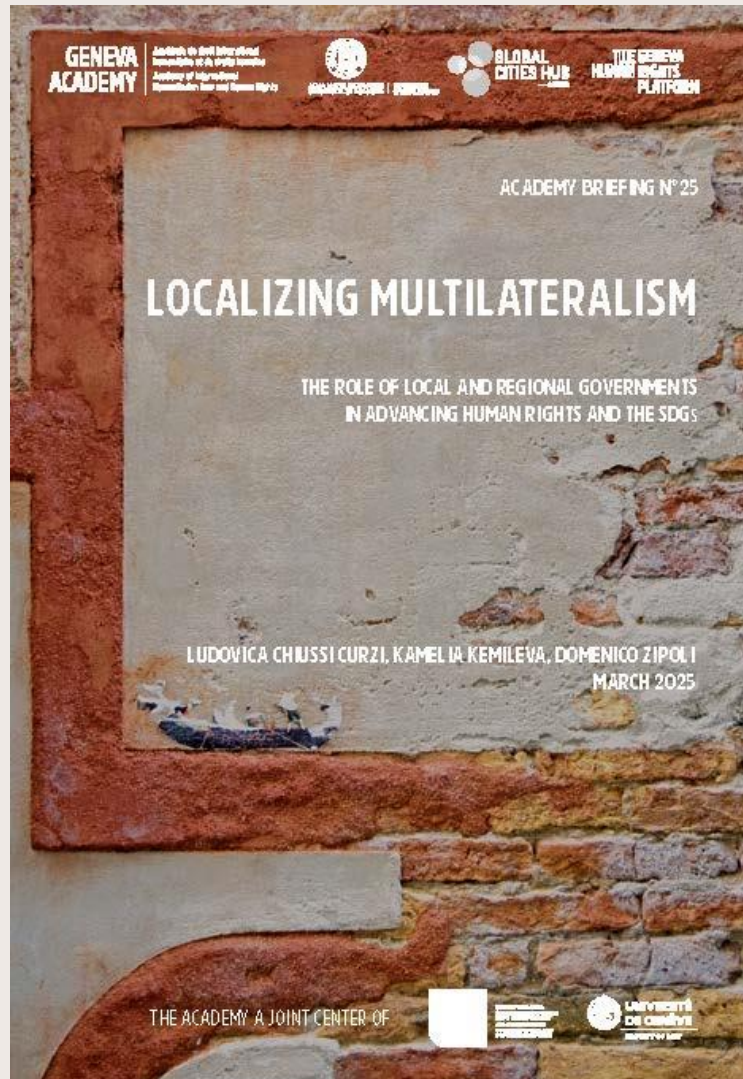
