The UN Human Rights Protection System

Two Types of UN Human Rights Mechanisms

- Charter-based Bodies :
 - Human Rights Council (HRC)
 - Special Procedures
 - Universal Periodic Review (UPR)
- Treaty-based Bodies: that monitor the implementation of core international human rights treaties
 - CCPR
 - CAT
 - CERD





The UN Human Rights Protection System Complementarity and coherence between charter-based and treaty-based bodies – the 'all-mechanisms approach'

Treaty Bodies

- 9 Core Conventions, 10 Treaty Bodies
- Oversee the implementation of the HR treaties states have signed up to
- Issue recommendations and views on cases
- Ratifications from 196 (CRC) to 59 (CMW)

OHCHR

Triple role:

- Secretariat to Treaty Bodies
- Secretariat to Charter-based bodies,
- Independent HR mechanism

Human Rights Council

- The Human Rights Council is an intergovernmental body within the United Nations system made up of 47 States responsible for the promotion and protection of all human rights around the globe, created in 2006 by the GA via Res 60/251
- Develops new Norms
- Creates and is informed by special procedures
- Holds the <u>universal periodic review</u> as peer review of all UN member States
- Some follow-up to the TBs' recommendations
- Recurrent UPR recommendation: ratification of Treaties

The UN Human Rights Treaty Bodies – Main functions

Consideration of Reports / Constructive Dialog

- Timing according to Convention (around 4-5 year)
- Based on Report by the State + "shadow" reports
- Reporting compliance currently around 15%
- Different methods: LOIPR, Common Core Document
- Result: Concluding Observations (COBs)

Inquiry Procedure

- 6 TBs: CAT, CEDAW, CRPD, CED, CESCR, CRC
- Confidential and cooperative
- May include a visit with consent of the state
- No harmonized approach

General Comments

Interpretation of Conventions

- Builds on established practice / TB "jurisprudence"
- Informs the formulation of questions and COBs
- Important tool for CSO advocacy

Individual Communications

- 8 TBs: CCPR,CERD, CAT, CEDAW, CRPD, CED, CESCR, CRC may receive and consider individual complaints or communications
- Very uneven distribution

The UN Human Rights Treaty Body System – engagement options for Cities, local and regional government

Reporting

- Informally submit information «alternative report»
- Contribute to the national report

Dialog

- As part of the national delegation
- As observer
- Via informal meetings with the Committees

Expert-Level Human Rights Mechanisms: Special Procedures of the UN Human Rights Council



Mandate

A/60/251: - **promote** universal **respect** for the **protection** of **all** human rights and fundamental freedoms for **all**

- address **situations** of violations of human rights, including gross and systematic violations, and make recommendations thereon.
- promote the effective coordination and the mainstreaming of human rights within the United Nations system

The UN Human Rights Protection System The Universal Periodic Review (UPR) of the UN Human Rights Council

- A unique mechanism of the Human Rights Council that calls for each UN Member State to undergo a peer review of its human rights records every 4.5 years.
- Basis: 1) "national report" based on a "broad consultation process"; 2) information contained in the reports of independent human rights experts and groups, known as the <u>Special Procedures</u>, human rights <u>treaty bodies</u>, and other UN entities; 3) **information from other stakeholders**
- Other States ask questions and make recommendations
- State under Review notes or accepts recommendations

The UN Human Rights Protection System Entry points for LRGs to the UPR

Contribute to the National Report

The UPR Resolution requires states to undertake inclusive consultations to wirte its report

Submit information to other states

Other states ask questions and issue recommendations to the State under Review. They can be informeed...

Use the UPR Outcome

Many recommendations of the UPR relate to action to be taken on the regional / local level

- housing; health; education, penitentiary system and poliice...
- UPR Recommendations which endorsed by the national government can be used to create political pressure

Report on the realization of rights

VLR → UPR

e.g. in informal events, UPR Mid-term reporting etc

The Special Procedures of the UN Human Rights Council

- The crown-jewels, the eyes and ears, the experts ... but also the feet on the ground
- Special Procedures,
- Typically 1 person (pro bono, part time), supported by 1.5 staff at OHCHR
- 1-2 Thematic reports per year (HRC + GA)
- 2 Country visits resulting country specific reports to the HRC
- Interaction with LRGs
